







Wagnalls Financials

2024 brought significant resources to support the operations of the Memorial and begin some repairs and restoration work. The second annual gala raised approximately \$26,000. A private donor made a stock gift value just over \$100,000 for restoration of the original stained glass and lead glass windows. The Library was also a recipient of \$50,000 of OTSCIF monies through the State of Ohio budget thanks to Senator Shaeffer to repair windows in the library. Just a start to a very big undertaking.





Public Library Funds (PLF)

Our Library does not receive any county tax dollars. We do receive a portion of the State of Ohio's PLF. Over the past two years, our percentage of the Fairfield County PLF, has decreased by 1.49%, which is approximately \$75,000 annually. We received \$358,880 in PLF for 2024. We used \$50,000 in Library carryover funds on our 2024 budget, which we do not have for future years. This has resulted in the Library reducing/changes in staff and fewer hours of operation. Here is the breakdown of how these funds were spent.




